The Society's 2017 Activities

Frederick S. DeMarr Library of County History is located on the lower level of the Greenbelt Public Library. The DeMarr Library was founded by Fred DeMarr, who served as President and Historian of the Society for a number of years. He was a life-long resident of the county and had an abiding interest in all aspects of Prince George's County history. His collection was donated to the Society by the DeMarr family after his untimely death in 1997.

The DeMarr Library continues to be staffed by a dedicated team of volunteers that assist visitors with historical and genealogical research, catalogue and organize the collections of written materials and maps, scan and index newsletters, archive obituaries along with all of the the other miscellaneous things that need to be done to keep the library running. We continue to receive collections of papers, articles, books, ephemera, and photographs to add to our collection. We are always in search of yearbooks from schools in the county, so if you have any to donate, please let us know. Materials do not circulate, but may be used at the DeMarr Library. Photocopies of non-copyrighted materials are free for Society members and color copies or items scanned onto a CD are available for a modest fee.

Membership and Sponsorship. We would like to thank members who renewed and new members who joined us in 2017. The membership cycle is on a calendar-year basis from January to December, with dues notices sent to members each December. A membership card is provided for each membership and sponsorship and all members receive the Prince George's County Historical Society's newsletter. Program discounts will periodically be offered to members. PGCHS members are able to receive a discounted membership with the Maryland Historical Society with payment of PGCHS dues annually or with status as a life member.

Preservation of the county's historic properties continues to be an interest of ours. During 2017, we continued to monitor Compton Bassett in Upper Marlboro. In early January 2017, the chapel at Compton Bassett (pictured) was restored and renovated. On June 3, 2017, the Society board along with the county's Historic Preservation Commission and the Hill Family were able to view the restored chapel and learn about some of the archaeology occurring on the grounds.

We continue to keep tabs on the Glenn Dale Hospital, Fairmount Heights High School, the Old Marlboro High School/Elementary School, the Old Stone Building, the Peace Cross, and other properties throughout the county.



<u>Public Relations</u> activities are through our website, <u>www.pghistory.org</u>, the *Then & Now* newsletter and Facebook page and blog. *Then & Now* continues to be our primary source to impart news and information to our members. Fundraising:

This year, the Society established funds in memory of two individuals who supported county history and preservation. The **John J. Petro Memorial Fund** was established in memory of its president John Petro. The monies raised will primarily provide funding for the ghost structures project at Mount Calvert in Upper Marlboro, MD, a project that John was interested in undertaking. The **John M. Essex Memorial Fund** provides financial assistance to scholars, authors, graduate students and doctoral candidates wishing to research the architectural heritage of Prince George's County, MD.

Programs and Activities:

The Society continued its partnership with Marietta House Museum and the Prince George's County Memorial Library System for a series of spring and fall lectures. Director **Maya Davis** presented "By Any Means Necessary: Methods of Escape by Maryland's Enslaved Community."

The annual St. George's Day awards and luncheon was held on April 9, 2017, at the College Park Airport in College Park and catered by Geppetto Catering. St. George's Awardees were:

On April 24 and May 21, 2017, the DeMarr Library hosted "A Night in the Stacks" to allow members, friends, and family the opportunity to peruse the hundreds of used books we have available for sale. Stop by the DeMarr Library to browse through the books when we are open.



The Society partnered with Calvert Brewing Company in Upper Marlboro for a membership mixer on April 27, 2017. Attendees were able to tour the brewery and sample their locally crafted beers, as well as learn about the area where the brewing company is located.

The annual Historic Preservation Week reception was held on May 25, 2017, at the County Administration Building in Upper Marlboro after a downpour forced us to move the event from Darnall's Chance. The Society partnered again with the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, ATHA/Maryland Milestones, the Prince George's County Historical & Cultural Trust, the University of Maryland, and other county organizations and businesses to

host the event. The Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission presented historic site plaques to seven recipients, Maryland Milestones presented their Heritage Tourism Awards, the School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation at the University of Maryland presented the Prince George's Heritage Fellowship Award, and the Surratt House Museum presented a certificate of appreciation. The Society gave the President's Preservation Award to **Michelle Kretsch** in recognition of her work at the Riversdale House Museum. The award is given to someone who supports the preservation of the county's history outside of the efforts of the Society.

Jane Taylor Thomas and **Nathania Branch Miles**, as the Society's representatives, joined with the Afro-American Historical and Genealogical Society, Inc. Prince George's County Chapter and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to host the 12th annual Juneteenth Celebration on June 17, 2017. The annual event commemorates the end of slavery. This year's workshops were for beginner to advanced family researchers ranging from genealogy, preservation, slave research, and DNA in genealogical research. There are special activities for children to introduce them to the world of genealogy and family history. This event is a complement to the family fun day hosted by the Prince George's County Department of Parks and Recreation at Walker Mill Regional Park.

Our annual Prince of a County fundraiser was held at the Don Speed Smith Goodloe House at Bowie State University, on September 24, 2017. The guest speaker for the afternoon was Ricardo C. Mitchell, President of the Bowie State University (BSU) Alumni Association. He regaled us with stories about his record setting football days as well as the history of BSU. Many thanks to Ms. Wedderburn and her team for opening the house and giving tours and **Nathania Branch Miles** for arranging the event.



The 22nd Annual Maryland Legacy Day was a co-sponsorship among the Prince George's County Chapter Afro American Historical and Genealogical Society, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and the Society. Maryland Legacy Day is in honor of the legacy and heritage of the enslaved men, women and children who became free on November 1, 1864. This year's celebration was held on November 18, 2017, at the LDS Cultural Hall in Suitland. The theme was "The Legacy of Maryland" From then Until Now!" with keynote speaker, Karsonya (Kaye) Wise Whitehead, an Associate Professor at Loyola University in African and African American Studies in the Depart of Communication.

The Society partnered again with the City of Bowie Museums for our annual holiday party and annual meeting at Belair Mansion on December 10, 2017. Thanks to ATHA/Maryland Milestones for its sponsorship of the event.

Prince George's Hall of Fame:

The portraits of distinguished Prince Georgians that were hanging in the County Courthouse in Upper Marlboro had to be removed this spring. The portraits are being stored and we are looking for new locations for them to be displayed. Our preference is for them to be located at venues so they can continue to educate the public and be enjoyed.
